

This simple activity/format can be used for any day, any topic, and many grade levels.

Suggestions for this activity:

- ❑ It might be a regular weekly activity that students can do during “free time” throughout the week with Friday being the day to “share” what they have learned.
 - Or, a homework/challenge activity for Friday sharing
- ❑ This activity might even provide an opportunity to teach students the difference between valuable information and trivia about some topic.
- ❑ This could be a class-saving activity for a substitute teacher when lesson plans are unavailable, but there is at least 20-30 minutes to prepare a list of 3-8 sites to use.
- ❑ Sites can be listed on the board or overhead, or may be printed out for students to reference at home, in the Media Center, or in a computer lab.

Generating a topic list:

- ❑ Early in the school year (or at the beginning of each month, quarter, or semester), the class could generate a list of topics about which they want to learn more.
- ❑ Topics might come from the subject areas and lessons a class is currently studying.
- ❑ Current events are a rich source of topics to explore.
